valley of the shadow of death.



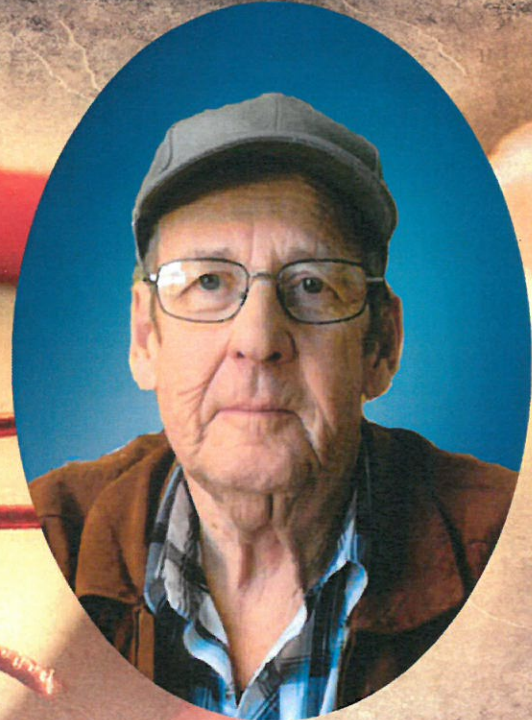
