Wesley "Wes" Ryan Green, beloved husband, father, grandfather, and friend, passed away peacefully on August 27, 2026, at the age of 75.

He was born on September 1, 1950, in Miles City, MT, to Roland Green and Cora Schell, joining his older brother Ron. He was later

adopted by his grandparents, Clarence and Elizabeth (Betty) Green.

Wes proudly served his country in the United States Army from 1969 to 1971 as a Vietnam veteran. Not long after returning home from Vietnam, Wes met his wife, Kristy. They were married on August 9, 1975, and shared 51 years of marriage together.

After leaving the Army, Wes began a long and hardworking career. He worked as a truck driver before discovering his passion for baking.
